



Psalm 117:1-2

Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles! Laud him, all you peoples! For his merciful kindness is great toward us and the truth of the Lord endures forever. Praise the Lord! (NKJV)

Praise:

Halal-to be clear (orig. of sound, but usually of color); to shine; hence, to make a show, to boast; and thus to be (clamorously) foolish; to rave; causatively, to celebrate; also to stultify

Laud:

Shabach-to address in a loud tone, i.e. (specifically) loud; figuratively, to pacify (as if by words)

Gentiles:

Gowy-a foreign nation; hence, a Gentile; also (figuratively) a troop of animals, or a flight of locusts

People:

'ummah-a collection, i.e. community of persons

Merciful kindness:

Checed-kindness; by implication (towards God) piety: rarely (by opposition) reproof, or (subject.) beauty

Great:

Gabar-to be strong; by implication, to prevail, act insolently

Truth:

'emeth-stability, certainty, truth, trustworthiness

In this Psalm, as in so many others, the Psalmist exhorts us to be loud in our praise and then gives us a reason for the exuberance. Here we have two reasons: God merciful kindness is great toward us and his truth endures forever.

Scripture references:

Psalm 22:27

All the ends of the world shall remember and turn to the Lord, and all the families of the nations shall worship before you.

Yes, all kings shall fall down before him; All nations shall serve him.

For as the heavens are high above the earth, so great is his mercy toward those who fear him...

Psalm 108:4

For your mercy is great above the heavens, and your truth reaches to the clouds.

Psalm 145:8

The Lord is gracious and full of compassion, slow to anger and great in mercy.

Psalm 71:22

Also with the lute I will praise you -- and your faithfulness (*truth*), O my God! To you I will sing
with the harp, O Holy One of Israel.

Psalm 86:15

But you, O Lord, are a God full of compassion, and gracious, longsuffering and abundant in
mercy and truth.

Psalm 138:2

I will worship toward your holy temple, and praise your name for four lovingkindness and your
truth; For you have magnified your word above all your name.
