

Psalm 132:7

Let us go into His tabernacle; Let us worship at His footstool. (NKJV)

Let us go to the sanctuary of the Lord; let us worship at the footstool of his throne. (NLT)

Tabernacle (tabernacles in KJ):

Mishkan-a residence (including a shepherd's hut, the lair of animals, figuratively, the grave; also the Temple); specifically, the Tabernacle (properly, its wooden walls).

Worship:

Shachah-to depress, i.e. prostrate (especially reflexive, in homage to royalty or God).

Footstool:

Hadam-to stamp upon; a foot stool.

Scripture references:

Psalm 43:3

Oh, send out your light and your truth! Let them lead me; Let them bring me to your holy hill and to your tabernacle.

Psalm 46:4

There is a river whose streams shall make glad the city of God, the holy place of the tabernacle of the Most High.

Psalm 99:5

Exalt the Lord our God, and worship at his footstool -- he is holy.

Psalm 99:9

Exalt the Lord our God, and worship at his holy hill; for the Lord our God is holy.

Psalm 138:2

I will worship toward your holy temple, and praise your name for your lovingkindness and your truth; for you have magnified your word above all your name.

Isaiah 66:1

Thus says the Lord: "Heaven is my throne, and earth is my footstool. Where is the house that you will build me? And where is the place of my rest?"
