

Psalm 145:21

My mouth shall speak the praise of the LORD, and all flesh shall bless His holy name forever and ever.

Speak:

Dabar-to arrange; but used figuratively (of words), to speak; rarely (in a destructive sense) to subdue: answer, appoint, bid, command, commune, declare, destroy, give, name, promise, pronounce, rehearse, say, speak, be spokesman, subdue, talk, teach, tell, think, use [entreaties], utter, well, work.

Praise:

Tehillah-laudation; specifically (concretely) a hymn

Flesh:

Basar-flesh (from its freshness); by extension, body, person; also (by euphem.) the pudenda of a man: body, [fat, lean] flesh [-ed], kin, [man-] kind, nakednessself, skin.

Bless:

Barak-to kneel; by implication to bless God (as an act of adoration), and (vice-versa) man (as a benefit); also (by euphemism) to curse (God or the king, as treason): abundantly, altogether, at all, blaspheme, bless, congratulate, curse, greatly, indeed, kneel (down), praise, salute, still, thank.

Scripture:

Psalm 35:28

And my tongue shall speak of Your righteousness and of Your praise all the day long.

Psalm 71:8

Let my mouth be filled with Your praise and with Your glory all the day.

Psalm 119:171

My lips shall utter praise, for You teach me Your statutes.

Psalm 16:9

Therefore my heart is glad, and my glory rejoices; My flesh also will rest in hope.

Psalm 63:1

O God, You are my God; Early will I seek You; My soul thirsts for You; My flesh longs for You, In a dry and thirsty land where there is no water.

Psalm 84:2

My soul longs, yes, even faints for the courts of the LORD; My heart and my flesh cry out for the living God.
