

Psalm 64:10

The righteous shall be glad in the Lord, and trust in him. And all the upright in heart shall glory. (NKJV)

The godly will rejoice in the Lord and find shelter in him. And those who do what is right will praise him. (NLT)

Righteous:

Tsaddiyq-just

Glad:

Samach-to brighten up, i.e. (figuratively) be (causatively, make) blithe or gleesome

Trust:

Chacah-to flee for protection, to confide in

Upright:

Yashar-straight (literally or figuratively): -convenient, equity, Jasher, just, meet (-est), pleased well right (-eous), straight, (most) upright (-ly, -ness)

Heart:

Leb-the heart; also used (figuratively) very widely for the feelings, the will and even the intellect; likewise for the centre of anything

Glory:

Halal-to be clear (orig. of sound, but usually of color); to shine; hence, to make a show, to boast; and thus to be (clamorously) foolish; to rave; causatively, to celebrate

Try this translation: (not literal) “The just will be glad in the Lord (their countenance will show it) and run to him for protection and confide in him. Those who please the Lord in the very center of their being will be clamorously foolish, raving about, boasting and celebrating the Lord.”

Scripture references:

Psalm 32:11

Be glad in the Lord and rejoice, you righteous; and shout for joy, all you upright in heart!

Psalm 33:1

Rejoice in the Lord, O you righteous! For praise from the upright is beautiful.

Psalm 68:3

But let the righteous be glad; let them rejoice before God; Yes, let them rejoice exceedingly.

Psalm 97:11

Light is sown for the righteous, and gladness for the upright in heart.

Psalm 97:12

Rejoice in the Lord, you righteous, and give thanks at the remembrance of his holy name.

Psalm 118:15

The voice of rejoicing and salvation is in the tents of the righteous; The right hand of the Lord does valiantly.

Psalm 140:13

Surely the righteous shall give thanks to your name; The upright shall dwell in your presence.
