



Psalm 97:7

“Let all be put to shame who serve carved images, who boast of idols. Worship him, all you gods. (NKJV)

“Those who worship idols are disgraced--all who brag about their worthless gods--for every god must bow to him.” (NLT)

Shame (Confounded in KJ):

Buwsh-to pale, i.e. by implication to be ashamed; also (by implication) to be disappointed or delayed

Serve:

`abad-to work (in any sense); by implication, to serve, till, enslave

Carved images:

Peciyl-an idol

Boast:

Halal-to be clear (orig. of sound, but usually of color); to shine; hence, to make a show, to boast; and thus to be (clamorously) foolish; to rave; causatively, to celebrate; also to stultify

Idols:

'eliyl-good for nothing, vain or vanity; specifically an idol

Worship:

Shachah-to depress, i.e. prostrate in homage to royalty or God

gods:

'elohiym-gods in the ordinary sense; but specifically used of the supreme God; occasionally applied by way of deference to magistrates; and sometimes as a superlative

Scripture references:

Psalm 49:6-7

Those who trust in their wealth and boast in the multitude of their riches, none of them can by any means redeem his brother, nor give to God a ransom for him...

Proverbs 27:1

My son, be wise. Do not boast about tomorrow, for you do not know what a day may bring forth.

Ephesians 2:9

...not of works, lest anyone should boast.
