

## **Bless**

**Hebrew:** Barak-to kneel or bow, to give reverence to God as an act of adoration, implies a continual conscious giving place to God, to be atuned to Him and His presence (translated blessed, praised, kneel).

Psalms 34:1 I will bless the LORD at all times; His praise shall continually be in my mouth.

Psalms 63:4 Thus I will bless You while I live; I will lift up my hands in Your name.

Psalms 100:4 Enter into His gates with thanksgiving, and into His courts with praise. Be thankful to Him, and bless His name.

Psalms 95:6 Oh come, let us worship and bow down; Let us **kneel** before the LORD our Maker.

**Greek:** Eulogeo-to speak well of, thank or invoke a benediction upon, prosper, praise.

1 Corinthians 14:16 Otherwise, if you bless with the spirit, how will he who occupies the place of the uninformed say "Amen" at your giving of thanks, since he does not understand what you say?
