

## **Joy**

**Hebrew:** simchah-blithesomeness or glee.

Psalms 16:11 You will show me the path of life; In Your presence is fullness of joy; at Your right hand are pleasures forevermore.

Zephaniah 3:17 The Lord your God in your midst, the Mighty One, will save; He will rejoice over you with gladness (joy in King James), He will quiet you with His love, He will rejoice over you with singing."

**Hebrew:** samach-to brighten up, blithe or gleesome.

Psalms 21:1 The king shall have joy in Your strength, O Lord; and in Your salvation how greatly shall he rejoice!

**Hebrew:** teruwah-clamor, i.e. acclamation of joy or a battle-cry; especially clangor of trumpets, as an alarm.

Psalms 27:6 And now my head shall be lifted up above my enemies all around me; Therefore I will offer sacrifices of joy in His tabernacle; I will sing, yes, I will sing praises to the Lord.

**Hebrew:** ranan-to creak (or emit a stridulous sound), i.e. to shout (usually for joy).

Psalms 5:11 But let all those rejoice who put their trust in You; Let them ever shout for joy, because You defend them; Let those also who love Your name be joyful in You.

Psalms 32:11 Be glad in the Lord and rejoice, you righteous; and shout for joy, all you upright in heart!

**Hebrew:** rinnah-a creaking (or shrill sound), i.e. shout of joy.

Psalms 42:4 When I remember these things, I pour out my soul within me. For I used to go with the multitude; I went with them to the house of God, with the voice of joy and praise, with a multitude that kept a pilgrim feast.

**Hebrew:** giyl or guwl-to spin round under the influence of any violent emotion, i.e. usually rejoice.

Psalms 51:8 Make me hear joy and gladness, that the bones You have broken may rejoice.

Psalms 105:43 He brought out His people with joy, his chosen ones with gladness.

**Greek:** skirtao-to skip; to jump, i.e. sympathetically move (as the quickening of a fetus).

Luke 6:23 Rejoice in that day and leap for joy! For indeed your reward is great in heaven, for in like manner their fathers did to the prophets.

**Greek:** chara-cheerfulness, i.e. calm delight.

Matthew 2:10 When they saw the star, they rejoiced with exceedingly great joy.

Luke 1:14 And you will have joy and gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth.

Luke 24:52 And they worshiped Him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy...

Acts 13:52 And the disciples were filled with joy and with the Holy Spirit.

**Greek:** agalliasis-exultation; specially, welcome.

Luke 1:44 For indeed, as soon as the voice of your greeting sounded in my ears, the babe leaped in my womb for joy.

Jude 24 Now to Him who is able to keep you from stumbling, and to present you faultless before the presence of His glory with exceeding joy...

**Greek:** agalliao-to jump for joy, i.e. exult.

1 Peter 4:13 ...but rejoice to the extent that you partake of Christ's sufferings, that when His glory is revealed, you may also be glad with exceeding joy.
