

## **Praise**

**Hebrew:** Hallah-to make a show or rave about, to glory in or boast upon, to be clamorously foolish about your adoration of God.

Psalms 148:1 Praise the LORD! Praise the LORD from the heavens; Praise Him in the heights!

Psalms 149:3 Let them **praise** His name with the dance; Let them sing praises to Him with the timbrel and harp.

Psalms 150:1 Praise the LORD! Praise God in His sanctuary; Praise Him in His mighty firmament!

Other references: Psalms 113:1; 117:2; 135:1

**Hebrew:** Tehillah-to sing Hallal, a new song, a hymn of spontaneous praise glorying God in song (sometimes translated praises).

Psalms 40:3 He has put a new song in my mouth -- Praise to our God; Many will see it and fear, and will trust in the LORD.

Psalms 100:4 Enter into His gates with thanksgiving, and into His courts with praise. Be thankful to Him, and bless His name.

Psalms 144:9 I will sing a new song to You, O God; On a harp of ten strings I will sing praises to You...

Isaiah 42:10 Sing to the LORD a new song, and His praise from the ends of the earth, You who go down to the sea, and all that is in it, You coastlands and you inhabitants of them!

Other references: Psalms 92:1; 78:4; 135:3

**Hebrew:** Yadah-to use (i.e. hold out) the hand, to throw (a stone or arrow) at or away, to revere or worship (with extended hands), thankful, thanksgiving.

Psalms 7:17 I will praise the LORD according to His righteousness, and will sing praise to the name of the LORD Most High.

Psalms 9:1 I will praise You, O LORD, with my whole heart; I will tell of all Your marvelous works.

Psalms 33:2 Praise the LORD with the harp; Make melody to Him with an instrument of ten strings.

Other references: Psalms 30:12; 138:2; 139:14

**Hebrew:** Zamar-to touch the strings or parts of a musical instrument i.e. to play upon it, to make music, accompanied by the voice, to celebrate in song and music, give praise, sing forth praises, psalms.

Psalms 21:13 Be exalted, O LORD, in Your own strength! We will sing and praise Your power.

Psalms 104:33 I will sing to the LORD as long as I live; I will sing praise to my God while I have my being.

Psalms 108:1 O God, my heart is steadfast; I will sing and give praise, even with my glory.

Other references: Psalms 57:7; 138:1

**Hebrew:** Todah-an extension of the hand, a vowel, adoration, a choir of worshipers, confession, sacrifice of praise, thanksgiving (sometimes translated praises).

Psalms 42:4 When I remember these things, I pour out my soul within me. For I used to go with the multitude; I went with them to the house of God, with the voice of joy and praise, with a multitude that kept a pilgrim feast.

Psalms 50:23 "Whoever offers praise glorifies Me; and to him who orders his conduct aright I will show the salvation of God."

Psalms 56:12 Vows made to You are binding upon me, O God; I will render praises to You...

Other references: Psalms 68:4; 75:9

**Hebrew:** Shabach-to address in a loud tone, a loud adoration, a shout, proclaiming with a loud voice (unashamed), to glory, triumph, a testimony of praise.

Psalms 63:3 Because Your lovingkindness is better than life, my lips shall praise You.

Psalms 145:4 One generation shall praise Your works to another, and shall declare Your mighty acts.

Psalms 147:12 Praise the LORD, O Jerusalem! **Praise** your God, O Zion!

Other references: Psalms 106:47 triumph; 117:1 laud

**Greek:** Aineo-to praise (translated praising).

Luke 2:20 Then the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things that they had heard and seen, as it was told them.

Luke 24:53 ...and were continually in the temple praising and blessing God. Amen.

Acts 2:47 ...praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to the church daily those who were being saved.

Other references: Luke 2:20; Acts 3:8

**Greek:** Ainos-a story, praise.

Luke 18:43 And immediately he received his sight, and followed Him, glorifying God. And all the people, when they saw it, gave praise to God.

**Greek:** Ainosis-the act of praising, to thank.

Hebrews 13:15 Therefore by Him let us continually offer the sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of our lips, giving thanks to His name.

**Greek:** Epainos-laudation, a commendable thing.

Ephesians 1:6 ...to the praise of the glory of His grace, by which He made us accepted in the Beloved.

Ephesians 1:12 ...that we who first trusted in Christ should be to the praise of His glory.

Ephesians 1:14 ...who is the guarantee of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession, to the praise of His glory.

**Greek:** Arete-manliness, excellence, virtue, (translated praises).

1 Peter 2:9 But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light...

**Greek:** Humneo-to hymn, i.e. sing a religious ode; by implication, to celebrate (God) in song.

Acts 16:25 But at midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing **hymns** (praises in KJV) to God, and the prisoners were listening to them.
