

Sing

Hebrew: Ranan-to creek, to emit a stridulous sound, to shout aloud for joy.

Psalms 51:14 Deliver me from the guilt of bloodshed, O God, the God of my salvation, And my tongue shall sing aloud of Your righteousness.

Psalms 95:1 Oh come, let us sing to the LORD! Let us shout joyfully to the Rock of our salvation.

Psalms 145:7 They shall utter the memory of Your great goodness, and shall sing of Your righteousness.

Other references: Psalms 59:16; 67:4; 149:5

Hebrew: Zamar-to touch the strings or parts of a musical instrument i.e. to play upon it, to make music, accompanied by the voice, to celebrate in song and music, give praise, sing forth praises, psalms.

Psalms 47:6 Sing praises to God, sing praises! Sing praises to our King, sing praises!

Psalms 61:8 So I will sing praise to Your name forever, that I may daily perform my vows.

Psalms 75:9 But I will declare forever, I will sing praises to the God of Jacob.

Other references: Psalms 18:49; 27:6; 33:2

Hebrew: Shuwr-strolling minstrelsy, to sing, singer (man or woman).

Psalms 33:3 Sing to Him a new song; Play skillfully with a shout of joy.

Psalms 57:7 My heart is steadfast, O God, my heart is steadfast; I will sing and give praise.

Psalms 96:1 Oh, sing to the LORD a new song! Sing to the LORD, all the earth.

Other references: Psalms 13:6; 27:6; 149:1

Greek: Psallo-to twitch or twang, i.e. to play on a stringed instrument (celebrate the divine worship with music and accompanying odes); make melody, sing, psalms.

1 Corinthians 14:15 What is the conclusion then? I will pray with the spirit, and I will also pray with the understanding. I will sing with the spirit, and I will also sing with the understanding.

James 5:13 Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing psalms.
