

Thanks

Hebrew: Yadah-to use (i.e. hold out) the hand, to throw (a stone or arrow) at or away, to revere or worship (with extended hands), thankful, thanksgiving.

Psalms 92:1 It is good to give thanks to the LORD, and to sing praises to Your name, O Most High...

Psalms 105:1 Oh, give thanks to the LORD! Call upon His name; Make known His deeds among the peoples!

Psalms 106:1 Praise the LORD! Oh, give thanks to the LORD, for He is good! For His mercy endures forever.

Other references: Psalms 35:18; 75:1; 136:1

Hebrew: Todah-an extension of the hand, a vowel, adoration, a choir of worshipers, confession, sacrifice of praise, thanksgiving (sometimes translated praises. thanksgiving).

Psalms 95:2 Let us come before His presence with thanksgiving; Let us shout joyfully to Him with psalms.

Psalms 100:4 Enter into His gates with thanksgiving, and into His courts with praise. Be thankful to Him, and bless His name.

Psalms 107:22 Let them sacrifice the sacrifices of thanksgiving, and declare His works with rejoicing.

Other references: Psalms 26:7; 147:7

Greek: Eucharisteo-to be grateful, to express gratitude, to say grace at a meal.

Luke 17:16 ...and fell down on his face at His feet, giving Him thanks. And he was a Samaritan.

1 Thessalonians 5:18 ...in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

Revelation 11:17 saying: "We give You thanks, O Lord God Almighty, the One who is and who was and who is to come, because You have taken Your great power and reigned.

Greek: Charis-acceptable, benefit, favor, gift, grace, gracious, joy, liberality, pleasure.

1 Corinthians 15:57 But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

2 Corinthians 2:14 Now thanks be to God who always leads us in triumph in Christ, and through us diffuses the fragrance of His knowledge in every place.

2 Corinthians 8:16 But thanks be to God who puts the same earnest care for you into the heart of Titus.

2 Corinthians 9:15 Thanks be to God for His indescribable gift!

Greek: Anthomologeomai-to confess in turn, respond in praise.

Luke 2:38 And coming in that instant she gave thanks to the Lord, and spoke of Him to all those who looked for redemption in Jerusalem.

Greek: Homologeō-to assent, covenant, acknowledge.

Hebrews 13:15 Therefore by Him let us continually offer the sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of our lips, giving thanks to His name.
